IMPORTANT NOTES!



- Please read pages 3-8 of this document for information about the certification process for junior officials. Follow the instructions on pages 9-17 to log into your SportsEngine account, access the USAV Academy, and then enroll in the related junior officiating courses.

IMPORTANT NOTES!



- Upon completion of a course and any on-court evaluation, the junior player's CREDENTIALS will be updated in SportsEngine.
- The OVR will rely on each team and club to ensure its players are properly educated in support crew/work team duties.

IMPORTANT NOTES!



- If you will keep score or work as second referee for your team, you must complete the respective courses for each of those (see pages 5-7) AND receive two on-court evaluations by a referee during a tournament. NOTE: Scorers should also complete the Libero Control module.
- If you will be the Libero tracker or will work as a line judge for your team, you must complete the respective courses for each of those; see page 8.



JUNIOR SECOND REFEREE TRAINING



The following modules are part of the OV25 OVR Junior Second Referee Training and should be completed to be certified as a junior second referee:

102q - Junior Second Referee (w/quiz) Runtime: ~23 min.

• 103q - Junior Signals (w/quiz) Runtime: ~16 min.



JUNIOR SCORER REFRESHER TRAINING



If you were certified as a junior scorer last season, the following modules, at a minimum, should be completed to be certified as a junior scorer this season:

 105q - Libero Control (w/quiz) min. Runtime: ~16

• 108 - Basic Scoring Example min.

Runtime: ~6

 109 - Basic Scoring Example – Deciding Set Runtime: ~5 min.



NEW JUNIOR SCORER TRAINING



If this is the first time you are being certified as a junior scorer, or if it has been more than two seasons since your last certification, the following modules should be completed in the New Junior Scorer Training Course:

JUNIOR LINE JUDGE & ASSISTANT SCORER COURSE



We recommend that ALL junior players complete the line judge and Libero tracker training course. The OVR and USAV do not certify line judges or Libero trackers, but training for each position is important to officiating a match.



After you click on a module, the module will begin to play automatically. Advance to the next slide by using the buttons at the bottom of the screen.






NAVIGATING



As you progress through a module, the navigation buttons in the upper right corner of the screen allow you to either advance to the next module in the course or to exit the course.










COMPLETING A MODULE





After viewing/completing all online modules in the Junior Second Referee or Scorer courses, the Academy will still say the course is INCOMPLETE. Don't worry! This is because the final step is to be evaluated on-court by a referee during a tournament. If you've viewed all the modules, there's nothing left to do in the Academy.



COMPLETION & CERTIFICATION



- After completing the designated online modules, you will need final evaluation on-court by a professional certified referee to complete your certification. (This is why the Academy will say your course isn't complete even though you've viewed all modules in that course.) Line judges and Libero trackers do not receive an on-court evaluation or certification.

- Provide the completed evaluations to your coach; they will retain these to take with them to your tournaments. Your SportsEngine account may not be updated with your new certification credential, but do not worry!

SPECTATOR/PARENT CONDUCT GUIDELINES 2023-2025 USA Volleyball Indoor Rules Book

- 1. USAV Volleyball has a "zero tolerance" policy for unsporting conduct at local, regional, and national events.
- 2. Harassment, intimidation, or unsporting words or actions directed towards other spectators, match participants, tournament staff, officials, including line judges and scorers, may result in removal from the event. Attendance at future events may also be impacted.

SPECTATOR/PARENT CONDUCT GUIDELINES AT USA VOLLEYBALL EVENTS

The following guidelines are intended to encourage positive spectating experiences in an enthusiastic, supportive environment for athletes, coaches, officials, and fellow spectators.

- USAV Volleyball has a "zero tolerance" policy for unsporting conduct at local, regional, and national events.
- Harassment, intimidation, or unsporting words or actions directed towards other spectators, match participants, tournament staff, officials, including line judges and scorers, may result in removal from the event. Attendance at future events may also be impacted.
- A current membership with USA Volleyball is required to participate in any game or game-like activities.
- Law enforcement, security personnel, and USA Volleyball Event Arbitrators (the "Green Shirts") play an important role in ensuring a safe, fair environment for our young athletes and should be considered important members of the tournament staff.
- Generate goodwill and good sportsmanship by being polite and respectful to others attending the event.
- The Event Director and/or Program Administrator must be notified when any illegal activity is witnessed.
- Spectator seating around the courts is for the primary use of those watching the match in progress. Spectators may rightfully choose to remain in a seat for an entire match without switching sides of the court.
- Alcohol may not be consumed courtside at any USA Volleyball Youth/Junior volleyball event.
- Club directors and coaches have a responsibility to address unsporting conduct, words, or actions, by spectators or parents associated with their club.
- 10. WARNING! Injury from flying objects incidental to the sport of volleyball may occur. Attend at your own risk. Please pay close attention to your surroundings and be alert at all times, especially during active play.





OHIO VALLEY REGION SPECTATOR/PARENT CONDUCT



In addition to the USA Volleyball Spectator & Parent Conduct Guidelines, the Ohio Valley Region has a "zero tolerance" policy when it comes to spectator conduct at local and Regional events. By entering a facility to attend an OVR-USAV sanctioned event, all spectators agree to abide by OVR and USAV Codes of Conduct. Failure to do so may result in removal from the facility. A pattern of unsporting conduct by a spectator(s) may result in a sanction being assessed to the team/club by the OVR Commissioner.

Attendance is a privilege, not a right!
