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OVR Junior Officials Development Program Goal

To provide educated, well-trained junior work teams for every OVR-sanctioned tournament match.



Program Background

- The OVR has a merited history of well-trained junior work teams
- Your cooperation in our Junior Officials Program will help us ensure that we are providing the best support officials for each match.
- As we say, "All teams want good work crews, so be sure your team is providing the same quality officiating that you expect when you're playing."

Junior Work Teams



- The "third team" on the court a junior work team consists of the following:
 - Second referee ("R2")
 - Two line judges
 - Scorer
 - Assistant scorer/Libero tracker
 - Scoreboard operator/"flipper"
 - Coach (or rostered adult)
 - MUST be at/near the score table throughout the match

Junior Work Team Equipment



- Second Referee
 - Bring your OWN whistle!
 - (An electronic whistle is permitted but not preferred since they are often not loud enough)
 - A timing device (wristwatch or stopwatch) is recommended
- Line Judges
 - Flags are typically provided by the tournament host or referees
- Scorer & Assistant Scorer/Libero tracker
 - Scoring materials, including scoresheets, pens/pencils, line-up sheets, are provided by the tournament host

Why do juniors have to participate as a work team?



- Volleyball is unique in that amongst junior sports, athletes are asked to participate as part of the referee crew on each match.
- During all OVR-sanctioned tournaments, a "work team" is assigned to each match to fulfill the duties of second referee, line judges, and scoring crew.
- Junior players fill these "work team" roles and must be properly trained and certified.
- The OVR Junior Official Certification Program provides training, instructions, and certification procedures to assist in this endeavor.

2. Click "Launch" next to the USA Volleyball Academy.









3. Sync the correct account if the system indicates that you need to.

4. Click Launch!




5. Locate the appropriate course to complete under "My Training"

Junior Officials Certification Process

Junior Officials Certification Process

STEP 1

- Complete the designated USAV Academy online training courses OR
- Attend an in-person clinic hosted by your club and presented by a certified OVR-USAV referee

STEP 2

- After completing Step
 1, the player must:
 - Receive two, on-court evaluations (for at least 1 set) from a certified OVR-USAV referee

OVR Junior Second Referee Certification



Annual Certification Requirements

- The following module must be completed:
 - OV25_101 OVR Junior Second Referee Training (~40 minutes)

Receive two on-court evaluations by a referee during a tournament

OVR Junior Scorer Certification



Annual Certification Requirements

- The following module must be completed:
 - OV25_102 OVR Junior Scorer Refresher Training (~30 min) <u>OR</u>
 - OV25_103 OVR New Junior Scorer Training (~50 min)
- Receive two on-court evaluations by a referee during a tournament

OVR Junior Line Judge and Assistant Scorer Courses



- The OVR recommends that <u>ALL</u> junior players complete:
 - OV25_104 OVR Junior Line Judge and Assistant Scorer Training (~30 min)
- NOTE:
 - The OVR and USAV do not certify line judges or Libero trackers; however, training for each position is important to officiating a match.

Completing your Certification



- The evaluation sheet used by referees can be found on the OVR website at: <u>OVR Junior Scorer & R2 Rating Forms</u>
 - Have an OVR Professional Referee complete the evaluation form!
- Provide the completed evaluations to your coach
 - They will retain these to take with them to your tournaments.
- Your SportsEngine account may not be updated with your new certification credential, but do not worry!

Club Responsibilities

- It is each club director's responsibility to ensure all coaches and players are aware of the Junior Official Certification Program and the associated requirements for online training or in-person clinics, and on-court evaluations.
- It is highly recommended that ALL players on a team be trained as line judges and Libero trackers.

Team Responsibilities

- Each team should have at least two trained, certified second referees and scorers.
- When a team does not have a certified second referee (or scorer) by April 1, a coach from that team will fulfill this duty.
- When a team has neither a certified second referee nor a certified scorer, a coach must fulfill the scorer duties; a junior player will be the second referee.
- The work team may have food/drink, but items must NOT be on the score table. Drinks should be capped.

Work Team Responsibilities

- The entire work team must report to the First Referee at the beginning of the timed, pre-match warm-up period.
 At the start of the 2-4-4 warm-up.
- If more than one player will keep score during a match, ALL scorers need to report to the first referee at the same time.

 o It is preferred that ONE player serve as the scorer for the match.
- If multiple players will work as Libero tracker and/or line judges during a match, ALL players need to report to the first referee at the same time.

Late / Incomplete Work Team

- A work team that is incomplete or that fails to report to the first referee in a timely manner prior to the start of the match, may be assessed a penalty of up to 4 points. The penalty points will be awarded to their opponent in the first set of their next match.
- If a late work team does not have additional matches to be played that day, a \$50 fine shall be imposed by the OVR Commissioner. A team that fails to report for an officiating assignment is subject to a \$100 fine and may be placed on suspension until the fine is paid.
- Why a penalty or fine?! Because a late work team delays the start of the match and impacts the flow of the tournament, which lengthens the tournament day.

Work Team Coach Responsibilities

- A work team coach (or rostered adult) must:
 - be at/near the score table for the duration of the match and must arrive by the end of warm-ups.
 - be familiar with USAV scoring procedures.
 - NOT use electronic devices.
 - work as second referee or scorer if the team doesn't have a certified junior player for either of these positions after the April 1 deadline

Electronic Devices

- Work teams are NOT permitted to use electronic devices while officiating a match.
 - o Exceptions are made for required medical devices.
- A watch for timing warm-ups or time-outs is permitted.
- Referees are instructed to issue ONE verbal warning PER DAY to a work team that violates this OVR rule.
- A subsequent violation will result in a 10-point penalty, assessed in the first set of the work team's next playing match.

Competency

- Teams or clubs that exhibit a pattern of failing to fulfill work team duties with a reasonable level of competency will be required to host an in-person clinic to provide additional training for the team(s).
- The clinic will be at the team's/club's expense.
- We do not expect work teams to perform at a "professional" level, but they must have working knowledge of: scoring procedures, primary second referee responsibilities, and basic line judge duties, respectively.

Respect

- Spectators/parents (and playing teams) must recognize that our work teams are comprised of 10- to 18-year-old KIDS.
 They are not professional officials.
- As such, the OVR expects our work teams to be treated with respect, regardless of ability.
 - o Failure by any spectator, parent or playing team to act accordingly may result reprimand, removal from the facility, or sanction levied against the team or club by the OVR Commissioner.
- Work teams are instructed to report inappropriate comments from teams or spectators to the first referee or tournament staff.







More Important Notes

Important Notes!



- By April 1 of each season, all OVR teams must have at least one trained and certified junior scorer and junior second referee.
- Coaches & Club Directors:
 - Please update junior officials' credentials within the OVR website.
 - Retain players' evaluation forms as proof of completion
 - Certification cards are no longer used
 - OVR Staff will update USAV Academy Modules on the first business day of each month.
- The OVR will rely on each team and club to ensure its players are properly educated in support crew/work team duties.

OVR - Sponsored On-Site Junior Officials Clinics



- Clubs/teams also have the option of utilizing pre-season oncourt training in conjunction with an in-person clinic to certify junior scorers and second referees.
 - An intra- or inter-club scrimmage or a preseason Friendship Tournament can be used for this purpose.

Participation with a USAV juniors' team involves more than just playing! Players are also part of the officiating crew when their team is assigned as the "work team" for a match. That means various players on each team need to learn how to keep score and/or track the Libero, work as a second referee, as well as work as a line judge. The OVR has a history of well-trained junior work teams. Your cooperation in our Junior Officials Program will help us ensure that we are providing the best support officials for each match.

Through USA Volleyball, the OVR provides a curriculum with online courses to train junior players for each of these support roles. In addition, in-person training clinics can be setup by a team or club. An in-person clinic may be particularly helpful for new clubs or for teams with players who have little or no previous experience with USAV. These clinics can also cover USAV playing rules, which may be helpful for new/newer coaches.
